



## SAFETY BRIEFING CHECKLIST

<u>Overall Safety</u>
LIFEJACKETS – How to fit – when to operate – how to operate.
<b>DECK SAFETY</b> – One hand for the boat and one hand for yourself – danger areas – winches/clutches – gybing.
<b>MAN-OVERBOARD EQUIPMENT</b> – Shout "Man-Overboard" – tell someone-keep pointing at the person in the water – throw liferings and equipment.
<b>EMERGENCIES</b> – Alert all onboard – wear lifejackets – leave belongings – get on deck – follow skippers' instructions – ensure everyone is accounted for.
<b>GENERAL</b> – How the domestic system work – gas routine or generator starting – where to stow gear.
<b>DELEGATION OF RESPONSIBILITIES</b> – Watch systems – nominate person in charge in the event of something happening to the skipper.
At least one other person should know the following
STOWAGE CHART
<b>LIFERAFTS</b> – Location – how and when to deploy – location of grab bag.
<b>MAN-OVERBOARD</b> – MOB procedure – how to get them back onboard – GPS MOB button. (even very experienced crews benefit from physically practicing this).
FLARES – Location – how and when to use them.
<b>COMMUNICATIONS</b> – How to switch VHF on and send a MAYDAY or DSC alert – how to operate EPIRBs if carried.
<b>SWITCHES</b> – Navigation lights, interior lights and electronics – GPS, sounder and log.
<b>FIRE</b> – Extinguisher location – how and when to operate – organize evacuation.
<b>ENGINE</b> – How to stop, start and control the engine.
<b>NAVIGATION</b> – Reading position off the GPS or chart – basic outline of the passage plan.
<b>ANCHORING</b> – How to drop and retrieve the anchor – with and without power.
FIRST-AID – Location of first-aid box and manual.
